## 104 International Women's Day Celebration in Nepalese Embassy Ottawa 9th March 2014

- d) Develop new strategies to help resolve the challenges of women in Canada that have been barriers for women's empowerment,
- e) Build the strategies to help the marginalized women in Nepal by conducting various outreach programs such as health camps, fundraising event and education and awareness programs,

- f) Develop partnership with Nepalese embassy and other organizations to help build the network,
  - During the interaction program the need of Women's Forum was voiced by Ms. Radha Basnyat who had been attempting to create NRN Women Forum in Ottawa since last three years. With the enthusiastic agreements of the participants NRN Women's Forum Ottawa was finally established.
