- 5. NRNA activities


This program is limited to

- 1. The Second Generation NRNs who are not older than 21 years on 30th September 2013.
- 2. The registered National Coordination Councils on or before 31st December 2012.
- 3. The definition of NRNs as per the constitution of International Coordination Council.

Selection Process

- 1. Each National Coordination Council (NCC) will be requested to nominate best achiever of the second generation NRNs from their country in each category.
- 2. A selection criterion will be available for each NCC to make a selection process more transparent, free and fair in NCC level.
- 3. Nominees are requested to write a profile addressing following three points.

- A. Your achievements in the nominated category and how did you achieve this level of excellence?
- B. Your future plan on how you will move forward in your carrier.
- C. Explain how you think the NRNA can contribute for the betterment of the NRN community in the country of you residence and for the betterment of Nepal.
- 4. Profiles from each NCC will be collected by NRNA Youth Forum and handed over to the global selection panel.



- 4 Selection panel (ICC level) will select five best achievers from all over the world (within participating NCCs)
- 5 The panel will also select regional best achievers in the nominated category for the region.
- 6 There will be 5 global best achievers and 6 regional achievers of the NRN movement. All of them will be promoted and rewarded. All nominees will be acknowledged and promoted.



We believe that recognition of the achievements the second generation NRNs is vital for the long term viability of NRN movement. We have started to work on this direction and hopefully we will get support from all of you in this project.
