

'Uterine Prolapse Project 2013' – initiation of Nari Nikunja Australia

The 'Uterine Prolapse Project 2013', initiated by Nari Nikunja Australia, has commenced officially, for which a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed between Nari Nikunja Australia and Helping Hand Community Hospital.

The aim of this project is to complete surgery for 50 women in the FY 2013 from remote areas of Nepal. There are few Satellite clinics in remote areas which will provide free screening processes required for this project. So far, the surgery for 7 women have successfully completed on Friday, 25 January 2013. The project is expected to be completed within next two months.

The project expects to serve the women from different remote parts of Nepal, who are suffering from uterine prolapse. Due to the limited resources in the hospital, surgeries will be carried out in batches. Each patient will take 3-5 days to get treated and recovered; hence the patient will be taken care in hospital during that period.

The project will provide financial assistance to cover transportation cost, hospital and food expenses occurred during the surgery and also the recovery period expenses of the patients. The project plans to assist and educate patients about the precaution and prevention measures for future and also encourage them to pass on information to other women sufferers back in village area.

The target area of this project is Kavre, Nuwakot, Makawanpur, Parbat, Kusma, Baglung, Nawalparasi, Siraha. The expected beneficiaries of UV surgery sponsored by Nari Nikunja Australia for FY 2012-13 will be in total 100.
